MINUTES

1. Discussion Items

- **Supplement Justification** a.
 - Right-of-Way revisions and delays in letting often cause the consultant effort exceeding the proposed scope and fee.
 - It was suggested that ODOT determine an expected number of right-ofrevisions so that consultants can determine when excessive revisions justify a supplement request.
 - ODOT advises consultants document and submit supplement requests when any delays or revisions cause work outside of scope.

b. **Contract Encumbrance**

- Fees set aside for "Task Orders for Services Already in Contract" are not encumbered at the time of the contract.
- Task orders for on-demand contracts are not encumbered at the time of the contract but with each task order.
- ODOT is researching funding options with moving more design projects to task order basis.

c. Contract Administration Guidelines

- The updated contract administration guidelines has been submitted to FHWA for approval.
- The new guidelines contain slight revisions for consultant selection.

d. **ODOT Funding**

- The department is still waiting on federal funding which is causing delays in contract funding and issuance of notice to proceeds.
- All contracts, supplements, and task orders that were executed by December 1, 2023 were sent to comptroller for funding.
 - 1. 206 contracts submitted for funding
 - 2. 80 POs have been encumbered
- ODOT expects retro funding to be approved and used for funding projects
- ODOT currently has approximately \$31M in pending contracts.
